Why did you start working at your company?

The lack of sleep and the occasional unfounded midnight epiphany that I forgot to place an order for the restaurant.

Where do you see yourself in five years?

Definitely in Montreal. I have found a home here.

What is one major challenge that you've had to overcome in your career?

Being accepted and taken seriously as a woman in a male-driven industry.

How did you overcome it?

By working twice as hard and showing that I could handle pressure.

What does success look like to you? Does Money = Happiness?

If I'm as excited to go back to work the next day as I was that first Saturday shift, then I feel successful. Money doesn't equal happiness. Money equals effort being paid off.

What is the most memorable milestone in your career?

When I was made a chef owner at L'Atelier d'Argentine.

Do you have any advice for other young professionals?

Pursue your dreams and be careful to wish for.

Where is your favourite place to wine/ dine in your city and why?

My home. I don't get to do it often, but when I do, it's the best setting.

When you're not working how do you love to spend your "Me" time?

With my two kids and my husband.

Argentina. Why? Why not!
